FROM THE STEERING COMMITTEE

Welcome to the 2005-2006 Annual Report of the New York State Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender (LGBT) Health and Human Services Network (the Network). Since its inception in 1994, the Network has developed into a complex statewide coalition of more than 50 community-based organizations that work to meet the health and human service needs of LGBT communities throughout New York.

Network members work in urban, rural and suburban parts of the state, serve historically marginalized communities such as people of color, low income and senior individuals, and have a proven track record of providing successful, community-relevant programs throughout New York. By focusing on non-HIV related health programs and services, Network members have worked diligently with New York State government to recognize the continuum of health care needs in LGBT communities. Because of the Network's education and advocacy, state lawmakers and state agencies are beginning to recognize issues relating to LGBT seniors and youth, substance abuse and mental health needs, in addition to many others.

This Annual Report makes visible the incredible strides that the Network has achieved by advocating at a state level for increased awareness and funding for the LGBT community. Organizations throughout the state continue to offer dynamic services to meet their community needs and participate on a state level to paint a comprehensive picture of the funding and other needs of the LGBT community.

This Report also highlights the ability of the Network to deliver services directly to LGBT communities in need. On very limited budgets, organizations have been able to diversify and share resources through the Network that result in the improvement of all services throughout the state. Increasing the funding for Network member organizations would provide much-needed support to underserved LGBT communities throughout New York. As the membership and programs of the Network continue to expand, and its efforts grow to positively impact more lives, the Network will need the continued support of government to address the health and human service needs of LGBT New Yorkers.

FROM THE EMPIRE STATE PRIDE AGENDA, COORDINATOR OF THE NETWORK

The Empire State Pride Agenda is proud to present the Network's 2005-2006 Annual Report.

As the coordinator of the Network, the Pride Agenda works with Network members to educate policymakers about the health and human services issues confronting New York State's LGBT communities. It also helps create innovative programs and collaborations with government that build upon tested and proven service delivery mechanisms Network members have developed on the local level. As a result, the Network has become a national model for collaboration and resource-sharing between state government and LGBT community-based service providers.

While Network members do a remarkable job of providing services on shoestring budgets to hundreds of thousands of LGBT New Yorkers and their families, many in the LGBT community still do not have the access they need to these critical programs due to severely inadequate funding. Only with the increased support of government and private foundations will Network members be able to provide the social services LGBT New Yorkers need to improve their lives so that they can be fully contributing members of their local and state communities.



OVERVIEW AND HISTORY

The Network is a coalition of more than 50 LGBT-specific and LGBT-supportive nonprofit groups and organizations that provide health and human services to LGBT New Yorkers and their families. Organizations serve upstate, downstate, urban and rural populations as well as LGBT individuals who are part of communities that have historically experienced marginalization, such as: youth, seniors, people of color, and low income and transgender individuals. The Network focuses on non-HIV related services, such as primary and preventive care, crime victim assistance, family counseling and education.

Through the efforts of The LGBT Community Services Center in New York City and the Empire State Pride Agenda, the Network was established in 1994 to respond to concerns about funding cuts that were then threatening lesbian and

gay community-based organizations. The community recognized at that time that while it was successful in increasing or protecting funding for HIV-specific programs, it was not as successful in obtaining funding for non-HIV programs. The Network was charged with the task of addressing: (a) the reality that government had failed to meet the pressing and unaddressed needs of New York State's large LGBT community; and, (b) the need for the community to organize and persuade state government to begin funding health and social services that targeted the LGBT communities. Since 1994, the Network has been meeting regularly and has expanded its reach to include organizations throughout the State.

By creating a strong infrastructure, Network members, with the support of the Empire State Pride Agenda, were successful in obtaining resources from New York State government beginning in 1997. Since then, the Network has secured more than \$22 million to fund community-based organizations throughout the state that address the specific health needs of LGBT New Yorkers.

WHO WE ARE

The average age of programs is 15 years. Programs range from newly established programs within larger agencies to organizations with more than 20 years of experience serving LGBT communities. Members have a proven track record of continuously serving the needs of their community.

More than half of Network member organizations have fewer than 6 full-time paid staff. With limited resources and a wide variety of needs, most Network member organizations rely on a regular volunteer base of between 10 and 50 people. Because these organizations are pillars in their communities and have local leaders on their boards of directors, their focus on community building has resulted in active volunteer numbers.

Annual budgets of Network member organizations range from less than \$100,000 to more than \$1 million. Network members are almost equally divided into the following budget categories:

Network members serve over 500,000 clients every year throughout New York State.
